PREFACE TO THE THIRD EDITION

Lotus Materia Medica

This is the third edition of the Lotus Materia Medica which was first published in August of 1995. The third editon of the *Lotus Materia Medica* was designed to be a complete rewrite and major upgrade of the *second edition*. My attempt has always been to create a modern and easy-to-use materia medica for homeopaths to use in daily practice, while still remaining accessible for use at home and in the classroom.

The changes made in this 3rd edition comprise my attempts to build on that philosophy. *Lotus Materia Medica* contains hundreds of new remedies and thousands of new updates and additions.

The *Lotus Materia Medica, third edition* was updated to be a more clinical, practical and easy-to-use reference guide to the vast homeopathic materia medica. After editing the *second edition*, I continued to add more modern terminology, cross references and corrected any errors that were found. The final step was to systematically survey the homeopathic and herbal literature for reliable additions and updates. The highest priority was to find more clinical information relevant to modern homeopathic, naturopathic and herbal practice.

The writings of Allen, Anshutz, Boericke, Burnett, Clarke, Cooper, Hale, Hahnemann, Hering, Julian, Paracelsus, Phatak and Radamacher formed some of the major resources from which the remedy monographs were compiled, formatted and updated. Each remedy is reviewed as to it's pharmacy, folklore, historical uses, keynotes, generals, provings, case histories and toxicological reports.

Also, traditional herbal lore and information from the ancient medicine was consulted, especially on the use of herbal and spagyric tinctures as therapeutic agents and general tonics.

The result is the *third edition* of *Lotus Materia Medica*, which contains more modern terminology and diseases. Over 200 new remedies, and thousands of new additions and updates, all in a small lightweight book for convenient use. Homeopathic Remedy Guide has been redesigned to better complement the Homeopathic Medical Repertory also written by Robin Murphy, ND.

Similar abbreviations and terminologies were used for both books and the alphabetical schema used in the remedy monographs was designed to relate to the chapters in the Homeopathic Medical Repertory. The *third edition* of *Lotus Materia Medica* has been rewritten over the past few years and the following major changes were made:

Changes to the Third Edition

- 1. **New Edition** The Lotus Materia Medica's subtitle has been renamed: 'Lotus Materia Medica: 1,400 Homeopathic and Herbal Remedies'. This new name was given to represent the 200 new remedies added in the third edition.
- New Format Lotus Materia Medica has been completely re-formated. The single column plan is replaced with a two column format. This was done to make the book

easier to read and to make more space available for adding new remedies to the book.

- New Editing Thousands of minor and major corrections have been made in the third edition of this book. Errors in spelling, grammar and formating have been corrected. Also the sentence and paragraph structure was updated and improved.

- 5. **New Remedies and Updates** New Remedies added from modern provings. Also additions from Allen, Boericke, Boenninghausen, Burnett, Clarke, Grimmer, Hahnemann, Hering, Julian, Kent, Knerr, Kunzli, Nash, Phatak and many more.

- 6. **Updated Remedy Abbreviations** The remedy abbreviations of this edition have been updated to match the abreviations in the Homeopathic Medical Repertory.
- 7. **New Remedy Gradings** The new remedy gradings for the *Lotus Materia Medica's Repertory* display the strongest remedies in the following manner: **CALC.**, (4 points), bold-capitals and underlined; **CALC.**, (3 points), bold-capitals-type; *calc.*, (2 points), bold-italics-type; calc., (1 point), plain-small-type.
- 8. **New Remedies** Over 200 new remedies were added to this edition. Many new homeopathic provings, herbal remedies, etc. were added in this edition.
- New Repertory A new clinical repertory has been added to the back of the book.
- New Remedy Index This expanded list includes the full latin names and common names for many homeopathic and herbal remedies.
- 11. **New Homeopathic-Herbal Glossary** A new glossary of Homeopathic, medical and herbal terminology has been added to this edition.
- 12. **New Homeopathy-Herbal Directory** Homeopathic and Herbal Resources. A listing of Homeopathic and herbal schools, organizations, pharmacies, bookstores, etc.

INTRODUCTION

Lotus Materia Medica: 1,400 Homeopathic and Herbal Remedies

The word 'materia medica' originates from the Latin word of 'mater' which means materials and 'medica' which refers to their use in medicine, therefore a materia medica translates as a Book of Medicines. The first Homeopathic Materia Medica was created by Hahnemann which he called the Materia Medica Pura, which translates as the Book of Pure Medicines. Homeopathic remedies were pure because their true medicinal actions were determined via provings not from theories or speculations. These energy medicines were also 'purified' of their earthy matter by the homeopathic method of potentizing substances via dilutions, triturations and succussions.

The Lotus Materia Medica is a book of Natural Medicines, because the homeopathic and herbal remedies have an affect on health and disease by enhancing the vital state of a person. Once the constitutional vitality is increased the healing forces become activated and health can be restored and fortified. This book contains over 1,400 of these Natural Medicines from the homeopathic and herbal materia medicas.

The writings of Allen, Anshutz, Boericke, Burnett, Clarke, Cooper, Hale, Hahnemann, Hering, Julian, Paracelsus, Phatak and Radamacher formed the major resources from which the remedy monographs were compiled, formatted and updated. Each remedy is reviewed as to it's pharmacy, historical uses, keynotes, generals, provings, case histories and toxicological reports. Also, traditional herbal folklore and information from the ancient medicine was consulted, especially on the use of herbal and spagyric tinctures as therapeutic agents and general tonics.

Title - The standard Latin botanical or chemical name, Sub-title - the common name or the remedy's traditional name.

Pharmacy - The remedy's abbreviation is found as it is written in the **Homeopathic Medical Repertory**. The remedy's Latin and common names are given. The abbreviation

N. O., stands for Natural Order or botanical family of the plant. Geographic location. How the remedy is prepared, by tincture or trituration. What parts are used to make the remedy. *Historical doses:* This section reviews the doses that have been used of the particular remedy, in a tincture, trituration or potencies. All remedies can be used in potency, but only the non toxic plants should be used for the spagyric and herbal tinctures. Remedies with possible spagyric or herbal uses are marked in the table of contents by underlining the remedy's Latin Name.

Clinical - In the clinical section is an alphabetical list of disorders and conditions that the remedy has helped in the past and present. The disorders in *italic type* are known to have been historically cured by the remedy.

Herbal - This section, shows the herbal remedy's folklore and traditional uses. The medical, herbal or history of the remedy, clinical experiences, herbal signatures, poisonings and case histories are reviewed. This section gives the botanical information of the remedies.

Homeopathic - The homeopathic section gives the remedy's therapeutic and general uses. The remedy's affinities for organs, systems or tissues are covered and the major keynotes, general and particular symptoms, plus the pathological uses of the remedy are given. Information from the homeopathic provings are included.

Mind - This section reviews the mental and emotional symptoms or states. Personality, ego and behavior. Mental functions such as, attention, memory, concentration, reason, thoughts, intellect. Emotions, such as fears, moods, weeping, anxieties, worries, depression, grief, frights, anger, hate, impulses, delusions, delirium, obsessions, gestures. Also, perceptions, self confidence, beliefs, insanity, etc.

Sections - This section of the monograph is an alphabetical schema of anatomical and physiological topics. Abdomen, Back, Blood, Bones, Brain, Breasts, Causations, Chest, Constitutions, Coughing, Ears, Eyes, Face, Female, Food, Head, Heart, Kidneys, Larynx, Limbs, Liver, Lungs, Male, Mind, Modalities, Mouth, Muscles, Neck, Nerves, Nose, Rectum, Skin, Sleep, Stomach, Stool, Teeth, Temperature, Throat, Tongue, Urine, Vertigo.

Comments - This section of the book includes historical and modern commentaries, folklore, case histories, remedy reviews, homeopathic provings, etc. Real life experiences and stories from the past are discussed from a practical point of view.

Relations - This part of the remedy monograph gives the various relationships which remedies can have with one another. For example there are antidotal, complementary, remedies which follows each other well and other relationships. *Compare:* Here the homeopathic or herbal remedy is compared with other remedies with similar symptoms or therapeutic uses. This section can be used to study similar remedies or to give new ideas for other remedies to consider in complex cases.

References - This section gives the major homeopathic or herbal references for each remedy's outline or commentary that is presented. The name of the author where the original material came from is listed. A list of all sources is found in the back of the book.

Homeopathic Remedies

Homeopathic remedies are energy medicines prescribed on the principle of similarity. Remedies that are in opposition to the immune response are antipathic or allopathic. Sympathy reflects the principle of likes cures likes. There is a sympathetic relationship between the action of the remedy on healthy persons, the provings and the therapeutic action on disease.

Homeopathic remedies contain prana or qi, (vital energy), they are pure prana remedies. When prana is suspended in a fluid or dry medium it can be potentized through a series of dilutions and succusions. The higher the potency means the prana of the remedy has become more pure and more exalted in its healing energy. Therefore these remedies work deeper and last alot longer in their action. Homeopathic remedies have gentle power to restore or to

heal. Their function is to neutralize disorders and to arouse the Vix Medicatrix Naturae, (the healing power of nature).

Higher states of vitality and health is a natural consequence of giving the proper homeopathic remedies. The goal in natural therapeutics is to always do the least and also to emphasize hygiene in all chronic disorders. Homeopathic remedies facilitate the self-restoration process. They neutralize the foci of disorder and therefore remove old shocks and traumas to the life principle.

Homeopathic Prescribing Techniques

Acute prescribing - Acute remedies are homeopathic remedies prescribed for acute infections and fevers. Examples: Aconite, Arsenicum album, Baptisia, Belladonna, Bryonia, Chamomilla, Gelsemium, Ferrum phos., Pulsatilla, Pyrogen.

Acute remedies are prescribed in the following manner: (1) Take the acute disease case, consider the keynotes and the major symptoms (2) Diagnose the cause and the type disorder the person has (3) Find a primary rubric or rubrics in the Homeopathic Medical Repertory such as, influenza, pneumonia, etc. (4) Differentiate the major remedies in the primary rubric, (influenza), by reading them in Lotus Materia Medica (5) Choose the most similar remedy (6) Choose the potency, amount and repetition of the dose (7) Follow-up the case and review to determine if the person needs the same remedy and potency, same remedy and different potency, different remedy and potency, etc.

The 30c and 200c are effective potencies for acute and emergency prescribing. When indicated, follow the acute with a deeper acting chronic remedy or a constitutional remedy to help restore health and prevent relapses.

Chronic prescribing - This refers to giving homeopathic remedies for chronic or long term degenerative diseases and weaknesses. Therefore the goals and method of approaching the case is different than in acute or emergency prescribing. Low potencies are very effective for these long term conditions. The homeopathic remedies can be given in a 6c or a LM/1 potency, one to three times a day for weeks or months at a time according to the case. The frequency can be adjusted to once or twice a day if three times a day is two strong for the patient. If after a period of time the 6c or LM/1, stops affecting the vitality, then go up to the next potency in the scale, like 12c or a LM/2 potency. Homeopathic remedies can be also given in a single dose of a high potency remedy which is repeated only after the improvements have relapsed.

Constitutional prescribing - The proper constitutional remedy will enhance and help maintain the general health. Constitutional remedies fortify people through times of stress or help one to recover from infectious or debilitating diseases. When the vitality is weakened, then one's susceptibility is increased to certain diseases. These homeopathic remedies are prescribed for the genetic vitality of the person. Constitutional remedies are often given to children while they are developing and to the weak and elderly. Some important constitutional remedies are: Bar-c., Calc., Calc-p., Sil., Phos., Graph., Sulphur and Lyc.

Emergency prescribing - Homeopathic remedies prescribed for injuries, bites, burns, shocks and traumas in any form. The important things to know are the causative factors and differentials for each emergency condition. Potency is selected as to availability, severity and how much time you have. The 30c and 200c are effective potencies for first aid, emergency and acute dosage. One dose equals a few of the pellets, tablets or two to four drops of liquid remedies. Take one dose of a 30c, 3 times daily for a few days, or as needed or take a dose of 200c, a few times daily for a few days, again repeat as needed. In severe cases, one may need to repeat the remedy more often if needed.

Epidemic prescribing - The epidemic remedies are found by using the frequent appearing symptoms and strong symptoms of the epidemic disease. The epidemic remedy is given in

repeated doses for a short period of time, a few days or longer if needed. These conditions are treated as acute diseases with 30c or 200c, or LM potencies. In case of mass epidemics the use of water potencies is essential. Take a few pellets or drops of the remedy and put it into a bottle of water, (4 or 8 oz. size) and shake well. This bottle can be preserved for long periods if 15% to 20% of the bottle is filled with pure alcohol. Also, each medicated remedy solution bottle can be grafted into new bottles by adding a teaspoon of the original to the new bottle and shaking.

Fundamental prescribing - The fundamental remedies give the personality types of the medicine. In some cases, the fundamental will be the same remedy as it is for the pathological layer. In some cases, the constitutional remedy will cover the fundamental and the pathological layers.

Isopathic prescribing - Isopathically using the 'same' substance potentised as a remedy (rather than a 'similar' substance). These remedies are made from discharges, toxins, allergens and nosodes. Isopathic remedies help eliminate toxic chemicals and heavy metals. If there is a strong history that a certain disease, bacteria or virus caused a person's condition then one would consider giving a isopathic remedy.

Miasm prescribing - Miasms are the tendencies and predispositions to certain diseases, like allergies or infectious diseases. If a person has predisposition to get colds and sore throats, then the acute remedy was given and it worked, but the colds and sore throats keep coming back. Here an anti-miasmatic remedy is indicated like Tub., or Bac.

There are five major miasms: Psora, Cancer, Sycosis, Syphilis and the Tuberculosis miasm. Miasms can be dormant or active. Miasms can be acquired by a person during their lifetime or miasms can be inherited from the parents. Miasms should not be treated routinely, but only when they are clearly activated or when one gets stalled in a case and there is a miasm present. Gonorrhea and Cancer are the dominant miasms today.

Acquired miasms are very prevalent, because a lot acute diseases get suppressed by drugs. These suppressed diseases can alter one's susceptibility to the environment and lower their vitality. A family history of certain disease patterns helps to confirm, the presence of an active or dormant miasm. Treat the active miasms when ever they show themselves. Let the dormant miasm alone until they become active.

Pathological prescribing - Pathological remedies are given for their similarity to the disease, as opposed to the fundamental and constitutional remedies which are aimed at the person in general. A pathological state should usually be treated first in many cases because it is the source of much suffering and pain. Pathological states are not limited to physical diseases alone. Also, mental and emotional diseases can form pathological layers and diseases. Examples are depression, mania, personality disorders, senility, violence behavior, insanity, etc. Low potencies in repeated doses are effective for severe pathologies like cancer and for those cases in which the patient is taking allopathic drugs.

Tautopathic prescribing - Tautopathically using the 'same' substance potentised as a remedy (rather than a 'similar' substance). These are the remedies made from allopathic drugs or chemicals. Tautopathics are made from cortisone, morphine, penicillin, histamine, etc. If there is a strong history that a certain drug caused a person's condition then one would consider giving a tautopathic remedy.

Herbal Prescribing Techniques

Herbal Tinctures - The herbal tinctures enhance the vitality and act also as specific tonics for weak organs and the vital systems. Herbal tinctures are plant extracts which stimulate the organs or systems of the body. These tinctures are alcoholic solutions of plant materials. Herbal remedies are often given to children while they are developing or to assist people through times of stress. These remedies also help one recover from infectious or debilitating

diseases. When a person's genetic vitality is weakened, then one's susceptibility is increased towards certain diseases.

Herbal Tonics - The word tonic means tone as in musical tones. When the right tone is given it acts as a tonic. If continual vital tones are given then we achieve a sound body and a sound mind. Spagyric or Herbal Remedies give the vital tones that revitalize and restore the weak spirit and the elemental body. These are the vitality remedies that will raise up the health of the whole person. Tonic remedies improve the strength and harmony of the organs and vital systems.

The signs of health emerge from prolonged consumption of the spagyric tinctures in small drop doses. Some of the signs of health are: Wakes refreshed in the morning, clear mind, calm emotions, sense of well-being, strength, flexibility, stamina, adaptable, vitality, clarity and harmony in all the vital systems.

Tonics are given in the following manner: Take the remedy bottle and succuss it 5 times or hit it against a hard book. Then take 5 or more drops of the herbal tincture and put in 1 oz. water, this is stirred or shaken and then consumed. Repeat this three to four times per day, between meals. To adjust the spagyric tonic the person can increase the number of drops taken, from 5 drops go up to 10 drops, etc. If the tonic is too strong the person may reduce the amount of times they take the remedy from 3 times to 1 or 2 times a day or decrease the number of drops.

Spagyric Herbal Tinctures - Spagyria is from two Greek words, 'spao', to draw out, to extract, to divide and 'ageiro' to bind, join, combine, gather. The spagyric art translates as plant alchemy, the art of separating, exalting and recombining medicinal herbs and roots. This word was coined by Paracelsus, a medical alchemist of the 16th century. He also created the phrase: Similia similibus curentur, the famous 'likes cures likes' principle of homeopathy. These preparations are from plant origins. Their therapeutic effect is more tonic and nutritive because they contain the mineral rich plant ashes.

The spagyric herbal tinctures are alcoholic solutions of plant substances. They are prepared by maceration of the plants into pure alcohol and allowing this solution to mature over several weeks. Seven day cycles, usually 14 or 21 days, etc. The work is done at the appropriate planetary day and hour. The mixture is shaken once a week at the right time. After the allotted time has elapsed the mixture is then separated into its liquid and solid components. The plant pulp which most galenic herbalist discard is calcinated, that is, burned to a fine ash. This ash is mineral rich and gives the spagyric a very nutritive and tonic effects. This adds to the remedy an earthy elemental tone to its signature. Thus the spagyric tonics are in a 'stereo mode' while normal herbal remedies are in a 'mono mode'.

Spagyric herbal tinctures are given in the following manner: Take the remedy bottle and strongly shake it 5 times or hit it against a solid object like a book. Then take 5 drops of the spagyric tincture and put in 1 oz. water. This is stirred or shaken and then consumed. Repeat this three to four times per day, between meals. All the spagyric, herbals and homeopathic remedies in low potencies can be given in this same manner. To adjust the spagyric tonic the person can increase the number of drops taken, from 5 drops go up to 10 drops. If the tonic is too strong the person may reduce the amount of times they take the remedy from 3 times to 1 or 2 times a day. There are many levels of spagyric pharmacy and this is a simple method to begin with. The next level is called Spagyric Essences.



ABELMOSCHUS HIBISCUS

(Musk-seed)

PHARMACY - abel. Abelmoschus hibiscus. Musk-seed. Musk-mallow. Hibiscus abelmoschus. N. O. Malvaceae. The dried seeds are used for making the mother tincture. *Historical dose:* Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Addison's disease. Anemia. Asthma. Delirium. Dysphagia. Dyspnea. Edema. Glaucoma. Headache. Lymphangitis. Migraine. Neuromyelitis. Paralysis. Polyneuritis. Ptyalism. Stomatitis. Tachycardia. Tetany. Trembling.

HERBAL - Abelmoschus is a shrub found in Egypt, the East Indies and Mexico, where it is known as musk-seed. The branches are downy with long leaf stalks and yellow flowers. The fruits appear as capsules containing numerous kidney bean shaped seeds. They emit a pleasant odor like that of musk and their taste is aromatic.

HOMEOPATHIC - Abelmoschus affects the stomach, uterus, mucus membranes and nerves. Trembling and paresis or even paralysis of the limbs with edema. Trembling or paralysis of the lips and jaw. Feeling of constriction in the chest. Excessive salivation with a feeling of dryness in the mouth. Sleepiness, difficulty swallowing.

MIND - Fears at night. Irrational fear of animals. Fear of animals, insects, flies, spiders, scorpions or snakes. Obsession of being attacked by venomous animals. Delirium with hallucinations.

Chest - Sharp pain in the chest.

Ears - Diminished ability to hear, when descending the stairs.

Eyes - Acute and chronic glaucoma. Detachment of the retina. Scotoma with spots before the eyes, impedes the vision. Tearing pain, as if produced by nail.

Face - Face pale, yellow, itching.

Food - Desire for food and cold drinks (Phos.).

Head - Migraine headaches. Heavy feeling in the head, as if it were being clamped in a vice (Crot-c.).

Heart - Feeling of tightness around the precordial region. Rapid beating of the heart with anguish. Tachycardia.

Limbs - Edema of the hands and legs.

Lungs - Asthma. Difficult breathing.

Modalities - Worse at night. Worse from descending the stairs (Calc.).

Mouth - Thick, sticky saliva. Excessive salivation, but feeling of dryness in the mouth. Difficulty with speech. Ptyalism neurotic of pregnancy and mercurial stomatitis. Maxillary trismus.

Stomach - Pain in the pit of the stomach. **Throat** - Dysphagia.

RELATIONS - *Compare:* (1) Staph., which is also a preventive of mosquito bites. (2) Apis, sharp, stinging and searing pains, partial or general edema, absence of thirst. (3) Ars., anxiety with fear of death. Nocturnal restlessness, worse between 1 a.m. and 3 a.m. Edema of the eyelids, especially the lower lid, thirst for small quantities of iced water.

ABIES CANADENSIS

(Hemlock Spruce)

PHARMACY - abies-c. Abies canadensis. Hemlock Spruce. Canada pitch. Picea alba. Pinus Canadensis. Tsuga canadensis. N. O. Coniferae. Pinaceae. Tincture of fresh bark and young buds. *Historical dose:* Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Aphthous, ulcers. Burns. Chills. Cholera. Colds. Constipation. Croup. Coughs. Diarrhea. Flatulence. Gangrene. Gonorrhea. *Indigestion*. Leucorrhea. Liver, disorders. Night-sweat. Prolapsed, anus. Prolapsed, uterus. Rheumatism. Stomach, disorders. Uterine, displacements. Vertigo. Vomiting.

HERBAL - A strong decoction of the bark of this tree is beneficial in leucorrhea, prolapsed uterus, prolapsed anus, diarrhea, etc., administered internally, and used in enema.

It is of service as a local application in gangrene, and in aphthous, and other oral ulcerations.

The essence (oil) of hemlock is diuretic and highly stimulant. As a liniment this oil has been used in croup, rheumatism, and other affections requiring a stimulating local application.

Dr. W. K. Everson states it to be a superior remedy in gastric irritation to allay vomiting in cholera morbus, etc. The dose is 5 or 10 drops in water, every 10 or 20 minutes, until relief is afforded.

It is likewise of value in passive hemorrhages, and is useful topically in scalds and burns. General asthenic state, with feeble digestion, vascular weakness, and pale mucus membranes. Broncho-pulmonary irritation, with profuse secretions. Coughs and colds. Renal torpor. Pyrosis and gastric irritation with vomiting and diarrhea. Never to be used in inflammatory or sthenic conditions.

HOMEOPATHIC - Marked symptoms in mucus membranes and stomach, a catarrhal condition of the stomach is produced. Characteristic cravings and chilly sensations. Useful for women with uterine displacements, probably due to defective nutrition with debility and lack of tone.

The skin is cold and clammy, hands cold, very faint. Respiration and heart action are labored. The right lung and liver feel small and hard. *Great appetite*, tendency to overeat. *Gnawing, hungry, faint feeling* in epigastrium. Wants to lie down all the time.

MIND - Easily fretful or quiet and careless. Patient wants to lie down all the time on account of nervous weakness and feels faint. Abdomen - Flatulence disturbs the heart's action. Sick feeling in the bowels. Burning and distention in abdomen with palpitations. Rumbling in the bowels after eating, with great appetite.

Back - Pain behind the right shoulder blade. Weak feeling in sacral region. Feeling as of cold water between the shoulders.

Eyes - Sensation as of a stye in outer canthus of left eye.

Female - Uterine displacements. Sore feeling at fundus of uterus, relieved by pressure. Prostration, wants to lie down all the time. Sensation as if the uterus is soft and feeble.

Food - Great appetite. *Tendency to eat far beyond capacity for digestion*. Craving for meat, pickles, radishes, turnips, and artichokes. Craving for coarse food, such as pickles, radishes, turnips, etc. Canine hunger with torpid liver.

Head - Feels light-headed, tipsy.

Heart - Action of the heart labored. Increased action of the heart with distention of the stomach.

Limbs - Hands cold, shrunken. Lies with the legs drawn up. Very faint, as if top of head were congested. Twitching of the muscles.

Liver - Sensation as if the liver were small and hard, as if bile were deficient.

Lungs - Breathing labored. Sensation as if the right lung were small and hard.

Kidneys - Urinates frequently day and night.

Straw colored urine.

Mouth - Dryness of the mouth.

Rectum - Burning in rectum. Constipation.

Sensations - A feeling as if the right lung and liver were small and hard, pain beneath right scapula. The patient lies with the legs drawn up. Shivering as if the blood turned to cold water. Uterus feels soft.

Skin - Clammy and sticky.

Stomach - Catarrhal condition in the stomach, increases the patient's hunger. *Gnawing, hungry,* and *faint feeling* in the epigastrium. Distention of the stomach and epigastrium, burning.

Temperature - Cold chills, as if blood were ice water (Acon.). Chills run down back. Cold-water feeling between shoulders (Am-m.). Skin clammy and sticky. Night sweat (Chin.).

Vertigo - Tipsy feeling, a swimming of the head, light-headed.

COMMENTS - According to Hale, Abies c. cured a light-headed feeling, attended with a gnawing, hungry and faint feeling at epigastrium. A craving hunger which, if gratified, was followed by distention of the

stomach and hard beating of the heart.

RELATIONS - *Compare:* (1) Acon. Chin. Am-m.

ABIES NIGRA

(Black Spruce)

PHARMACY - abies-n. Abies nigra. Black Spruce. Double Spruce. Picea mariana. Picea nigra. N. O. Coniferae. Pinaceae. North America. Tincture of gum. *Historical dose:* Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL-Backaches. *Belching*. Bone aches. Chills. *Constipation*. *Coughs*. Depression. *Dyspepsia*. Fevers. Heartburn. Hemorrhages. Hypochondriasis. Indigestion. Intermittent fever. Malaria. Menses, delayed. Rheumatic pains. *Stomach*, *disorders*. Stomach, pain. *Tachycardia*. *Water brash*.

HOMEOPATHIC - Abies-n has been used in many diseases, when they are associated with stomach symptoms. The dyspepsia caused by abuse of tea or tobacco has been cured by it.

Characteristic sensation in the cardiac end of the stomach or in the esophagus, "as if a hard body, as a hard-boiled egg had lodged there." Where this symptom is present, whether in dyspepsia or lung disease with or without hemoptysis, constipation, Abiesn. will be the most likely remedy. Patients describe this sensation, as if a hard lump is felt in the pit of the stomach or in the lung, which he wants to cough out.

Wakeful at night with hunger. Rheumatic pains and aching in bones. Abies-n in *dyspeptic troubles of the elderly* with functional heart symptoms, also after tea or tobacco. Distress in the head with flushed cheeks often accompanies the dyspeptic symptoms of this remedy.

"Pain in the stomach always comes after eating," said Guernsey. Constipation. Worse after eating. In lung disease when the sensation is as if there was a hard substance to be coughed up. Feeling in the epigastrium as if food were lying there (Puls., Bry.).

MIND - Very low spirited, unable to think or study. Hypochondriasis.

Back - Pain in small of back. Rheumatic pains and aching in bones.

Causations - Useful in indigestion in those who abuse tea drinking, tobacco smoking or tobacco chewing.

Chest - Painful sensation, as if something were lodged in the chest and had to be coughed up. Lungs feel compressed, cannot be fully expanded. Worse from coughing. Water brash succeeds cough. Choking sensation in throat.

Ears - Pain in left external meatus.

Female - Menstruation delayed for three months.

Food - Exceedingly hungry and wakeful at night. Great craving for food at noon and night. Total loss of appetite in morning.

Head - Hot with flushed cheeks. Low-spirited. Dull during the day, wakeful at night. Unable to think.

Heart - Heavy, slow beating of heart. Sharp, cutting pain in heart. *Tachycardia* and bradycardia.

Limbs - Rheumatic pains and aching in the bones.

Lungs - Easily gets out of breath. Difficult breathing, worse lying down.

Modalities - Worse after eating.

Mouth - Offensive breath.

Rectum - Constipation.

Sleep - Sleepy during the day. Wakeful and restless at night with hunger. Very bad dreams.

Stomach - Indigestion. Belchings. *Pain in stomach always comes on after eating.*Sensation of a lump that hurts. *As if a hard-boiled egg* had lodged in the cardiac end of stomach. Distressing constriction just above the pit of the stomach, as if everything were knotted up.

Temperature - Alternate heat and cold. Chronic intermittent fever with pain in stomach.

Throat-Choking sensation in throat. Sensation of something sticking in esophagus toward its lower end.

COMMENTS - Clarke after giving Abies nigra to one patient, he noted that the coldness around the stomach was removed and general chilliness greatly lessened.

RELATIONS-Compare: (1) Lump in stomach, Chin., Bry. Puls. (2) Nux-v. Kali-c. Chin., has the lump under the sternum, but higher up. (3) Also other Conifers - Thuj., Sabina, Cupressus - painful indigestion.

ABROMA AUGUSTA RADIX

(Olat Kambal)

PHARMACY - abrom-aug. Abroma augusta radix. Olat kambal. Perennial Indian hemp. Devil's Cotton, Abrome, N. O. Sterculiaceae. Tincture of leaves, roots. Historical dose: Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Aching, pains. Amenorrhea. Colicky, pains. Constipation. Cough. Debility. Dysmenorrhea. Dysentery. Edema. Emaciation, Headaches, Hoarseness, Insomnia. Itching. Leucorrhea. Malaise. Menstrual, colic. Menorrhagia. Throbbing, pains. Vertigo.

HERBAL - Abroma augusta, indigenous to India, is an evergreen large shrub or a small tree with drooping branches. It grows wild in India's warmer regions, but is also cultivated in gardens for its beautiful deep scarlet flowers. The roots and bark are used as an emmenagogue.

HOMEOPATHIC - The proving, carried out from 1970-1973 by the Central Council for Research in Homoeopathy, consisted of 40 provers and 20 controls. Dr. D. N. Ray, of Calcutta, made a short proving in 1919 and Kishore made one in 1972, all provings are included in the drug picture.

General debility. Feeling of weakness after stool. Tingling and numbness, feeling of warmth and burning. Trembling, lethargy, weakness, uneasiness, drowsiness and heaviness in the whole body.

Body aches particularly in the joints, aggravated by rest, during movement. Malaise, with feverishness, cough. Emaciation and weight loss with general debility. Edema and puffiness in the whole body, first appeared in face and eyes with eruption, aggravated from heat or motion, ameliorated by cold, rest.

MIND - Peevishness. Anxiety. Restless with dislike for everything. Quarrelsome. Easily excited and easily angered. Contradiction is unbearable. Irritability, moroseness. Indifference, vacantness, Sadness of mind. Feeling of joy. Immoderate laughing from

Abroma augusta radix

Abdomen - Griping pain in the abdomen with dysentery, aggravated in the evening. Colicky pains. Dislikes a tight band around the abdomen, brings on suffocative attack, with soreness near right hypochondrium. Rumbling and ineffectual urging for stool. Flatulent distension of upper abdomen with moderate urging before stool. Feeling of warmth in upper abdomen.

Back - Aching, lameness and sharp pains in lumbar region. Bubbling sensation in left lumbar region. Sore, bruised pain in lumbar region, worse morning on rising, better motion. Aching or tingling in the nape of the neck. Pressure and constriction in the nape of neck.

Chest - Aching pain in the whole chest. Burning in chest. Sharp pain in left infra-clavicular region with catching of breath. Stinging pain in left side of the chest. Aching pain in the left intercostal muscles. Catching pain in the right lower chest with weakness and tiredness, worse movement.

Ears - Pain and soreness with stitching sensation inside the right ear, worse evening, better during the day.

Eyes - Redness of eyes without pain or discharge, ameliorated from cold application. Itching in the right eye with redness, better rubbing the eyes. As if foreign body is lodged in the eyes. Heaviness of upper evelids. Watery exudation with redness of left eyeball. Burning in eyeballs with vertigo. Sore pain, aggravated by sunlight, ameliorated by closing the eyes. Aching pain in right eyelid. Agglutination, redness and swelling of eyelids.

Female - Amenorrhea. Dysmenorrhea. Menses scanty or copious. Menstrual colic and heavy bleeding. Pain in the lower abdomen, with delayed and scanty menstrual flow. Menses with dark colored clots. Leucorrhea with pain in the back and lower abdomen. Yellowish, white offensive leucorrhea. Leucorrhea, thin,

acrid, whitish discharge. Pain in right ovarian region, better hot applications. Thin, profuse leucorrhea in emaciated young girls.

Food - Voracious appetite. Loss of appetite. Dislike for food with heaviness of abdomen. Increased thirst for cold water with dry mouth. Thirstlessness. Aversion to smoking. Aversion to starchy food. Desire for fish, juicy things. Desire for sweets, Desires coffee and tea. Desires salty foods, sour foods.

Head - Headaches with heaviness and dull aching pains. Aching and throbbing pains. Burning sensation, better application of cold water. Tingling pain. Heaviness in forehead. Sharp pain in forehead, ameliorated by pressure. Bursting pain. Dullness, dizziness, and heaviness in forehead, ameliorated by bathing. Throbbing pain in temples. Heaviness, aching pains. Dull pain in vertex, warmth in vertex. Sensation as if being pressed with a blunt object over the supraorbital region.

Heart - Heart, palpitations with undesirable feeling of distress inside the chest, better lying quiet.

Kidneys - Urination followed by weakness and exhaustion. Fishy odor of urine.

Limbs - Aching in the limbs with weakness. Aching pain in shoulder joints. Tenderness in flexor, pronator group of muscles of forearm. Trembling, burning pain in left hand. Paresis, numbness and tingling in right lower extremely with anxiety, insomnia and restlessness. Heaviness of limbs. Tiredness in thighs. Aching pain in the knee joints. Lameness and stitching pain. Drawing pain in calf muscles.

Lungs - Shortness of breath with sense of suffocation, with fever, worse during inspiration, lying down on left side. Dry and barking cough. Suffocative cough. Cough with expectoration, whitish or yellowish, salty, mucoid, sticky, thin or thick. Lumpy sputum resembling boiled starch, easily hawked up, worse at night. Must support the chest during cough. Sensation as if the respiratory tract would be torn out.

Male - Lack of sexual desire in males.

Mouth - Dryness of tongue and lips. Sore pain due to the ulceration of the corners of the mouth. Tenderness and swelling of gums, worse chewing, better cold application. Aching pain with swelling of the gums, worse when eating or from any attempt to move the jaw. Stitching pain in gums on right side.

Nose - Sneezing with weakness. Burning in the nose with fever and coryza. Profuse coryza, thin, watery, bland discharge with sneezing. Sensation of obstruction of nostrils at night. Thick, yellow, mucopurulent discharge with weakness.

Rectum - Inactivity of rectum. *Obstinate constipation*. Constipation and headache. Ineffectual desire for stool and rumbling inside abdomen. No desire for stool with pain in abdomen. Hard nodular stool. Weakness after stool. Unfinished sensation after each stool. Constipation with hard, scanty stools. Insufficient, and straining with stools. Stools hard balls like sheep dung.

Skin-Intense itching all over the body, with pimple-like eruption. Dryness and burning sensation of skin, worse washing in hot water. Dry small vesicular and papular eruptions (resembling prickly heat) with black discoloration on different parts of the body. Itching without eruptions on the whole body, particularly thighs, during undressing, night, better open air.

Sleep - Insomnia. Sleepiness. Sleep in short naps. Restless tossing in bed with sensation of warmth, ameliorated by hard fanning. *Sleep disturbed by dreams*. Vivid dreams about accidents. Dreams of robbers and dreadful incidents. Dreams of extreme thirst. Dreams as if somebody is calling him by his name.

Stomach-Eructations, ameliorated by passing flatus. Heaviness in epigastrium with disgust for food and headache. *Feeling of emptiness*. Sharp pain in epigastrium. Colicky pain in the epigastrium with fullness of stomach. Nausea while taking food with watery stool, aggravated while eating.

Temperature - Heat all over the body at night with constant chilliness, body aches and sweat, aggravated at night. Temperature ranges between 99° to 100° F. Thirst at night, with fever.

Throat - Dryness at night, with great thirst. Hoarseness of voice. Soreness with tickling sensation and dry cough. Stinging pain in the left side of throat with headache. Stitching pain on right side of the throat with sore pain. Burning in throat with tickling cough aggravated in the evening.

Tongue - Bitter taste. Stinging pain in tongue, worse at midnight, from warm application. Heaviness and soreness of tongue.

Vertigo - Vertigo and giddiness with headache, worse lying down. Vertigo with nausea.

Vision - *Blurred vision* with aching pain in lids, aggravated by sunlight and bright light.

COMMENTS-In the female provers Abroma showed a capacity to relieve menstrual pains and to reduce the tendency to heavy bleeding. None of these provers had a history of leucorrhea but during the proving yellowish white leucorrhoea with offensive odour and pain in the lower abdomen was recorded.

In menstrual disorders it can be compared with Pulsatilla and Viburnum. Pulsatilla patients are generally mild and weep easily, whereas in Abroma the patient is bad-tempered and easily angered.

ABROTANUM ARTEMISIA

(Southernwood)

PHARMACY - abrot. Abrotanum artemisia. Southernwood. Lady's Love. Artemisia abrotanum. N. O. Composite. Southern Europe. Tincture of fresh leaves and stems. *Historical dose:* Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Anemia. Angioma. Arthritis. Ascarides. Brain, congestion. Chlorosis. Contractions. Dyspepsia. Emaciation. Epilepsy. Gastralgia. Gout. Hydrocele. Indigestion. Influenza. Malnutrition. Marasmus. Nervousness. Nosebleeds. Otorrhea. Peritonitis. Pleurisy. Restlessness. Rheumatism. Sleeplessness. Spinal congestion. Typhoid. Worms.

HOMEOPATHIC - The most prominent symptom of Abrot. is the emaciation in lower limbs. It has also an intense indigestion and morbid appetite. There are burning, gnawing, constricting pains and sometimes vomiting of offensive matters.

Marasmus, especially of lower limbs only, yet with good appetite. Marasmus of children. **Malnutrition with a failure** to thrive.

The face is wrinkled, pale, old looking, feels cold, blue rings around eyes. Oozing of blood and moisture from navel of newborn. Nosebleed and hydrocele in boys. Chlorosis.

Phagedenic diseases. Contractions of limbs from cramps or following colic. Sudden aching pain in back better by motion. Symptoms are worse at night and in cold air.

A peculiar sensation is as if the stomach were hanging or swimming in water. Weak, sickly feeling, when excited, trembling. Great weakness after influenza (Gels., Kalip.). A pressing sensation remaining after surgery upon the chest for hydrothorax or empyema (Calen.).

Ill effects of suppressed conditions, especially in gout. Tuberculous peritonitis. Exudative pleurisy and other exudative processes.

Metastasis of states and symptoms. Metastasis of rheumatism from joints to heart, to spine.

Rheumatism from suddenly checked diarrhea, cannot move her head, arms or limbs and suffers much pain, no swelling.

After suppressed gout. Gout, painful and inflamed wrists and ankle joints. Joints stiff with pricking sensation. Painful inflammatory rheumatism before swelling. Aggravation of hemorrhoids, when rheumatism improves.

MIND - Feebleness and dullness of the mind. Easily fatigued by conversation or mental effort. No capacity for thinking, as if all bodily and mental power were gone. Thinks brain is softening. Indolence, aversion to physical exercise. Gloomy, desponding.

Exceedingly peevish. Ill-natured, irritable and violent. Cross, anxious and depressed. Excited, loquacious, feels like shouting. Taciturnity. Feels she would like to do something cruel, no humanity.

Abdomen - Weak, sinking feeling in bowels. Hard lumps are felt in different parts of abdomen. *Bloated and distended*. Tuberculosis peritonitis. Blood and moisture oozing from navel of newborn.

Back - Sudden aching pain in the back, worse night, better motion. Pain in lumbar region extending along spermatic cord. Pain in sacrum with hemorrhoids. Back weak with ovarian pain.

Chest - Pain across chest, sharp and severe in region of heart, rheumatism. Pleurisy, when a pressing sensation remains in affected side, which impedes free breathing (Acon., Bry.).

Constitutions - Suited to disorders of newborn children, especially boys. Children with emaciation, especially of legs. Marasmus. Digestive weaknesses in the elderly.

Eyes - Blue rings around dull-looking eyes. Hollow eyed, sunken features.

Face - Dry, cold, wrinkled skin, as if old, with marasmus. Angioma of the face. Acne, comedones with emaciation. Pale, hollow-eyed appearance.

Female - Menses suppressed. Darting pain in left ovary. Back weak with ovarian pain. Twitching in both ovarian regions, seems to extend to back.

Food - Gnawing hunger and whining. Craving for bread boiled in milk. The *appetite* is great, ravenous while emaciating. Emaciation progresses with good appetite. Marasmus. Loss of appetite. Food passes undigested.

Head - Cannot hold the head up on account of weakness of neck. Brain feels tired after conversation or mental effort. Veins distended on forehead. Scalp sore, especially left side, itching.

Heart - Metastasis of rheumatism to heart. Pulse weak and small.

Limbs - Lame and sore all over. Inability to move the limbs, due to rheumatism. Pain in shoulders, arms, wrists and ankles. Joints stiff and lame. Marasmus of lower limbs only. Legs are emaciated. Contraction of limbs from cramps or following colic. Painful contraction of limbs (Am-m.). Chilblains itch, frostbitten limbs. Cold, prickling, numb, fingers and toes. Gout in wrists and ankles.

Lungs - Raw feeling. Impeded respiration.

Dry cough following diarrhea. Cold air causes a raw feeling in respiratory tract.

Male - Hydrocele of boys.

Modalities - Better from loose stools. Better motion. Worse in cold air. Worse at night. Worse foggy weather. Worse wet weather. Worse from checked secretions, especially diarrhea.

Mouth - Slimy taste, acidic.

Nose - Nosebleeds. Dryness of nose.

Rectum - Alternating diarrhea with constipation. Food passes undigested. Rheumatism after suddenly checked diarrhea. Destroys worms, especially ascarides (Cina). Protruding hemorrhoids with burning from touch. Hemorrhoids appeared and became worse as rheumatic pains abated. Frequent urging, bloody stools, worse as rheumatic pains abate.

Skin - Flabby and loose skin. Furuncles. Falling out of hair. Skin becomes purplish after suppression of eruptions. Itching chilblains.

Sleep - Restless, frightful dreams.

Stomach - Cutting, gnawing, burning pains, worse at night. *Gastralgia*. As if stomach is swimming in cold water. Indigestion with vomiting of large quantities of offensive fluid.

Temperature - High fever, rheumatism. Hectic fever with chilliness, very weakening, and marasmus.

COMMENTS - Characteristic metastasis and marasmus. "Metastasis" is an idea in homeopathy that's not limited to cancer. Metastasis means something disappeared and reappeared. Rheumatic fever followed by sore throat is also known as metastasis. If the throat cleared up but was followed by joint problems, that's a case of metastasis.

Keynote metastasis (Plat.), with a mental state alternating with a physical one. Metastasis in homeopathy is synonymous with "suppression" if there was outside interference. It's perceiving the alternation of states in the person. All the rubrics that say "alternation with..." are metastasis rubrics.

Useful for suppression, can correct the suppression in some cases. Indicated when a disorder has moved from one area and then to another.

Disorders often go to the intestines. Alternation of constipation and diarrhea. Crohn's disease, colitis, and irritable bowel syndrome.

A very powerful children's remedy for malnutrition, malassimilation, failure to thrive, marasmus (Aeth.), colitis and rheumatism. May have a big appetite and still lose weight. Can be emaciated with poor food assimilation (Iod., Cina). Especially useful when failure to thrive is accompanied with muscular weakness.

Loss of muscular strength, of muscle tone. Flaccid. Difficulty holding up head, in older children.

Metastasis of mumps with a large swollen parotid gland, often metastasizes to the testicles or the breasts (Puls., Carb-v.).

Clarke cured with Abrot. indigestion with vomiting of large quantities of offensive fluid (in a middle-aged woman).

RELATIONS - *Compare*: (1) Scroph., Bry., Stell. (2) Benz-ac in gout. (3) Iod., Nat-m. in marasmus. (4) Agar, Chin, Led, Nux-v. *Follows well*: Acon and Bry in pleurisy.

ABRUS PRECATORIUS

(Crab's Eye Vine)

PHARMACY - abr. Abrus precatorius. Crab's eye vine. Jequirity. Indian liquorice. N. O. Leguminosae. Papilionoideae. India. Tincture of trituration of the seeds. *Historical dose*: Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Cancer. Conjunctivitis. Epithelioma. Fever. Granular lids. Keratitis. Lupus. Malaise. Ophthalmia. Ulcers. Tumors.

HERBAL - Abrus precatorius is a climbing plant, a native of India, but has been introduced to the Western tropics. It was discovered by the natives of Brazil, who gave it the name Jequirity.

The Treasury of Botany notes that Abrus has small nearly globose seeds, which are of a brilliant scarlet color with a black scar indicating where they were attached to the pods. The seeds are used for necklaces and as a standard of weight under the name of Raté.

Abrus was the plant employed by Professor Nowack to determine weather and telluric forecasts owing to the extreme sensitiveness of its leaves to atmospheric disturbances.

HOMEOPATHIC - Abr. acts chiefly on the eyes, skin and mucus membranes. The general effects are headache, pain in the limbs, fever, and high pulse. Malaise. The roots are used in the same manner as licorice roots.

Eyes - Epithelioma, lupus, ulcers. Granular lids. Purulent conjunctivitis inflammation spreads to face and neck. Granular ophthalmia. Keratitis.

Head - Headache.

Limbs - Pain in limbs.

Skin - Erysipelatous inflammation of skin. Lupus. Indolent ulcers.

Temprature - High temperature and high pulse.

COMMENTS - Shoemaker, of Philadelphia, gave a series of striking cures with the remedy. He showed it to be useful for disorders of the skin showing great cell growth, lupoid conditions, epithelioma and sloughing ulcers.

In a case of ulcerative lupus of both sides of the nose, which was cured by five applications, the first was followed by an enormous amount of inflammation, accompanied by malaise, high fever, which lasted until the crust began to dry.

The preparation he used was made by decorticating two hundred grains of the beans by slightly bruising and crushing them in a mortar, the red hulls were carefully picked from the cotyledons.

The latter were put in a bottle and covered with distilled water. They were macerated for twenty-four hours, then transferred to a mortar and thoroughly triturated to a smooth paste.

Sufficient water was then added to make the whole weight 800 grains. Prepared in this way it was like an emulsion and was applied to the surface to be treated with a large camel hair pencil or mop.

The application of this emulsion to ulcerated surfaces was almost painless, but soon (often within an hour) there was much irritation and inflammation, the edges became red and infiltrated, surrounding tissues edematous and shining.

In the course of from six to twelve hours a desiccated curass-like crust formed which the cracked in twenty-four hours more and the discharge escaped freely. This went on for five or six days, the quantity of discharge diminishing. The crust then separated or was removed by water dressing and disclosed healthy granulations. If any unhealthy granulations were left, the application was repeated.

Shoemaker wrote, "This treatment exercises a destructive action on unhealthy granulated conditions followed by a constructive change. Also promoting under the protective cover of the exudation which it causes, a rapid development if healthy shin and tissue."

But it must be used with caution, for he noted, "It may give rise to erysipelatous inflammation and if used on weak and irritable patients cause great constitutional disturbances."

RELATIONS - *Compare*: (1) Jequiritol in cases of trachoma and pannus to engraft a new purulent inflammation. The poisons contained in Jequirity seeds are almost identical in their physiological and toxic properties with the similar principles found in snake venoms.

ABSINTHIUM ARTEMISIA

(Common Wormwood)

PHARMACY - absin. Absinthium artemisia.
Common Wormwood. N. O. Compositae.
Europe (Not to be confounded with Artemisia vulgaris, which is also called wormwood).
Tincture of fresh young leaves and flowers.
Historical dose: Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Brain, congestion. Chlorosis. Chorea. *Convulsions*. Delirium. Dyspepsia. *Epilepsy. Facial, twitching*. Headaches. Hysteria. Insanity. Insomnia. Impotency. Kleptomania. *Mushrooms, poisoning*. Nervousness. Opisthotonos. Otorrhea. Paralysis. Restlessness. Spinal congestion. *Tremors*. Typhoid.

HOMEOPATHIC - Absinthium has been proved, but a number of the symptoms were taken from observations made on absinthe drinkers. It causes hyperemia of brain, medulla and spine, more intense when combined with alcohol. Those who take absinthe are liable to hysterical manifestations.

This drug produces a perfect picture of *epileptiform seizure*. *Convulsions are preceded by trembling*, the patient makes grimaces, bites tongue, foams. Marked *tremors* of nerves, tongue and heart.

The giddiness and epileptiform attacks are the most important of the symptoms. *Sudden and severe, giddiness, epileptiform seizures*. Delirium with hallucinations and loss of consciousness. "A peculiar vertigo on rising with a tendency to fall backward."

Attacks occur in rapid succession.

Useful remedy for nervousness, restlessness, excitement and sleeplessness in children. Cerebral irritation, hysterical and infantile spasms come within range of this remedy.

This remedy has been used for *mushroom poisonings*. Opisthotonos. Intoxication. Chorea. Paralysis of inner organs.

MIND - Loss of memory. Forgets what has recently happened after and before convulsion. Wants nothing to do with anybody. Foolish look on face. Hallucinations. Frightful visions. Kleptomania. Insanity. Patient walks about in distress, seeing all sorts of demons. There is exhilaration followed by horrible delirium (Bell.), patient obliged to walk about (Art-v., Cham. and Cina. are better moving about).

Abdomen - Nausea, apparently in region of gallbladder. Bloated around waist and in abdomen, as after ague. Immense accumulation of flatulence in abdomen, wind colic. Liver feels swollen. Pain in spleen, it feels swollen.

Chest - Sensation of weight on chest. Irregular, tumultuous action of heart can be heard in back.

Constitutions - Younger and elderly patients. Chlorosis.

Ears - Discharge from ears after headaches. Otorrhea, especially after hemicrania.

Eyes - Pupils dilated unequally. Injected conjunctiva. Pain in eyes. Itching. Heavy lids.

Face - Foolish look. Rush of blood to the face. *Spasmodic facial twitching*. Makes grimaces and foams at the mouth in epilepsy. Face blue.

Female - Darting pain in right ovary. Premature menopause. Pains in uterus. Chlorosis. Promotes menses.

Food - Loss of appetite, loathing of food.

Head - Confusion in head. Dull occipital headaches (Gels. Pic-ac.). Wants to lie with the head low. Congestion of the brain and spinal cord.

Heart - Tumultuous action, heartbeats can be heard in back. Tremors of the heart felt toward the back.

Kidneys - Constant desire to urinate. Very strong odor, like horse's urine, deep yellow orange color (Kali-p.).

Limbs - Spasms of the body and limbs. Pain in limbs. Paralytic symptoms. Feet very cold.

Lungs - Cough with liver complaints.

Male - Spermatorrhea with relaxed, enfeebled parts. Impotency.

Mouth - Jaws firmly fixed. Bites his tongue in epilepsy. Tongue trembles, feels as if swollen and too large. Tongue thick, protruding, can scarcely talk. Tongue trembling, feels paralyzed.

Nerves - Falling down, as in epilepsy. Unconsciousness with distortion of the features, followed by spasms of the body and limbs. Bloody foam at mouth and biting of the tongue. Stupidity and the loss of memory afterwards. Opisthotonos, with grinding teeth, followed by stupor. Paralysis of inner organs.

Sleep - Sleeplessness, typhoid with congestion of base of brain. Nervous excitement and sleeplessness in children.

Stomach - Uncomfortable, irritated feeling of stomach. Food lies heavy. Stomach feels cold and oppressed. Nausea, retching, eructation.

Throat - Scalded feeling in the throat. Sensation as if a lump.

Vertigo - Vertigo on rising, with the tendency to fall backward.

COMMENTS - Clarke wrote about a case of epileptic vertigo with signs of constant cerebral and spinal congestion, nausea and tendency to frequent vomiting, persistent tremors, epileptic attacks of hysterical character and opisthotonos. Absinth. first in the tincture and later in 3c, completely cured.

Halbert regarded Absin. as of special service in cases of epilepsy where consciousness is not entirely lost. The characteristic symptoms include a sudden and severe giddiness, epileptiform seizures, delirium with delusions and loss of consciousness. For some time after the attack there is a loss of memory.

RELATIONS - *Compare:* (1) Alcohol, Agar., Artemisia, Hydrocy. acid, Cina, Cicuta.

ACALYPHA INDICA

(Indian Nettle)

PHARMACY - acal. Acalypha indica. Indian Nettle. Cupameni. Indian acalypha. N. O. Euphorbiacae. East Indies. Tincture of fresh plant. The fresh plant is macerated with two parts by weight of alcohol. Historical dose: Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Bloody expectorations. Chest, pain. Coughs. Diarrhea. Emaciation. Flatulence. Hemoptysis. Hemorrhages. Jaundice. Lung, cancer. Tuberculosis.

HOMEOPATHIC - Acal. is a remedy having a marked action on the alimentary canal and respiratory organs. The herbal tincture of the Acal. is a specific in hemorrhage from the lungs. Hemoptysis. Acal. is indicated in incipient tuberculosis with hard, racking cough, bloody expectoration, arterial hemorrhage, but no febrile disturbance.

All hemorrhages are aggravated in the morning. Very weak in the morning, gains strength during the day. Progressive emaciation, sense of weight in the stomach with sense of burning, flatulence and sputtering diarrhea.

Abdomen - Burning in the intestines. Sputtering diarrhea with forcible expulsion of noisy flatus. Bearing down pains and tenesmus. Rumbling distention and griping pain in abdomen. Rectal hemorrhage, worse in morning.

Chest - Dullness of chest on percussion, constant severe pain in chest.

Constitutions - Tubercular constitution. Hemorrhagic diathesis.

Heart - Pulse soft and compressible.

Lungs - Dry, hard coughs, followed by hemoptysis, worse in morning and at night. Expectorates pure blood in the morning and dark clotted blood in the evening. Cough most violent at night. Lung cancer with violent coughs followed by bloody expectoration or pure blood.

Modalities - Worse in mornings. Cough is aggravated at night.

Rectum - Diarrhea. Flatulence and sputtering diarrhea.

Skin - Jaundice. Itching and circumscribed furuncle-like swellings.

Stomach - Burning, sense of a weight in the stomach.

COMMENTS - Dr. Tonnere of Calcutta, India, seems to have been the first to call attention to this plant as a remedy. It first appears in a small work, Additions to the Homeopathic Materia Medica, collected and arranged by Henry Thomas, M. D. and published in London in the year 1858:

Thomas employed a 6x dilution in three cases of tuberculosis. In one case, there was a tuberculous affection of the upper portion of the left lung of two years' standing. Hemoptysis had been going on for three months, the expectoration had been pure blood in the morning, dark lumps of clotted blood in the evening, and the fits of coughing were very violent at night.

In this case, all homeopathic remedies had been tried unsuccessfully, then Thomas accidentally discovered the virtues of the Acalypha Indica, that remedy having been given him by a native for jaundice.

Henry Thomas said, "I prepared the mother tincture upon the homeopathic principle and took 10 drops, which brought on a severe fit of dry cough, followed by spitting of blood. After having noted all the symptoms experienced by myself and finding that they were nearly all similar to those of my patients."

Thomas gave six drops of the 6x dilution in half a tumbler of water. A spoonful was to be taken every half hour, beginning immediately at 9 a.m. At 6 p.m., the blood had stopped. He continued this for eight days and the blood never reappeared. The patient improved and auscultation proved the disease decreased. Thomas was hopeful to effect a cure.

In one case of passive hemorrhage from the lungs, after Arnica was used with little benefit, Acal. benefited and then failed, after which the use of Arnica entirely stopped the hemorrhagic flow.

Grimmer stated that "Lung cancer with a violent cough which followed by bloody expectoration or of pure blood, bright in the morning, dark and clotted in the evening. Dullness of chest on percussion, constant severe pain in chest. Progressive emaciation with a sense of weight in the stomach with burning. Flatulence with a sputtering diarrhea."

ACCUTANE

(Isotretinoin)

PHARMACY - accu. Accutane. Isotretinoin. Allopathic drug for acne. *Historical dose:* All potencies.

CLINICAL - Acne. Allergies. Anemia. Birth, defects. Bleeding. Bruises. Chest pain. Colitis. Conjunctivitis. Cysts. Depression. Diarrhea. Dry, skin. Edema. Emaciation. Eye, disorders. Fatigue. Hair, problems. Headaches. Hematuria. Hepatitis. Herpes. Incoordination. Itching. Joint, pains. Liver, disorders. Nausea. Night blindness. Nosebleeds. Palpitations. Photophobia. Rashes. Skin, disorders. Suicidal. Sun, sensitivity. Sunburns. Vertigo. Vomiting. Weakness. Wounds.

HOMEOPATHIC - Accutane, a chemical cousin of vitamin A, is prescribed for the treatment of severe, disfiguring cystic acne that has not cleared up in response to other drugs such as antibiotics. It works on the oil glands within the skin, shrinking them and diminishing their output.

Accutane can cause severe birth defects, including mental retardation and physical malformations. Some people taking Accutane have experienced headaches, nausea, and visual disturbances caused by increased pressure within the skull. Swelling of the optic nerve.

Abnormal hair growth or loss. Allergic reactions. Chest pain. *Delay in wound*

healing. Dry nose. Fatigue. Flushing. Liver disorders. Pinkeye.

Stomach and intestinal discomfort. Suppression of growth. Swelling due to fluid retention. Weakness. Weight loss.

Abdominal pain. Dizziness. Dry or cracked lips. Facial flushing. Incoordination and clumsiness. Headache, vomiting. Bleeding from the rectum. Severe diarrhea. Inflammatory disease of the bowels.

MIND - Accutane may cause depression or other mental problems. Nervousness. Emotional instability. Depression. Obsessive and compulsive disorders. *Mental retardation*. Self mutilation. Aggressive and violent behaviors.

In some cases, it has prompted thoughts of suicide. *Suicidal depression*. Some patients taking Accutane have had thoughts about hurting themselves or putting an end to their own lives. Some people tried to end their own lives.

Abdomen - Colitis. Bowel inflammation and pain. Pancreatitis.

Blood - Anemia. Bleeding from, gums, rectum, and nose. Changes in blood sugar or cholesterol levels.

Ears - Hearing problems.

Eyes - Conjunctivitis. Night blindness. Photophobia. Vision problems. Decreased night vision. Decreased tolerance to contact lenses. Swelling of the optic nerve.

Face - Facial flushing.

Female - Menstrual changes.

Head - Headaches.

Heart-Stroke. Irregular heartbeats. Sudden drop in blood pressure (causing unconsciousness).

Kidneys - Blood in urine. Urinary discomfort.

Limbs - Joint pains. Calcification of tissues. Tendon and ligament problems. Peeling palms or soles. Nail disorders.

Liver - Liver disorders. Hepatitis.

Mouth - Dry, mouth. Cracked and bleeding lips. Bleeding gums.

Nose - Dry, nose, Nosebleeds.

Perspiration - Profuse sweating.

Rectum - Bleeding. Diarrhea.

Skin - Dry, fragile skin. Severe cystic acne. Rashes. Skin infections. Sun sensitivity. Sunburn sensitive skin. *Delay in wound healing*. Abnormal hair growth. Bruises easily. Herpes. Itching. Changes in skin pigmentation.

Sleep - Drowsiness. Difficulty sleeping. **Stomach** - Nausea. Vomiting.

Temperature - Flushing.

ACETANILIDUM

(Antifebrinum)

PHARMACY - Acetan. Acetanilidum. Antifebrinum. Formed from aniline. Exalgine is a derivative from this Methylacetanilid and has almost identical action. *Historical dose:* Trituration and all potencies.

CLINICAL-Albuminuria. Asthma. Collapse. Cyanosis. Edema. Fainting. Palpitations. Thrombosis.

HOMEOPATHIC - Acetan. was used as a sedative and antipyretic for various forms of headache and neuralgia in doses of one to three grains.

Acetan. depresses the heart, respiration, blood pressure and lowers the temperature. Destroys red blood corpuscles, pallor. Cyanosis and collapse. Increased susceptibility to cold. Albuminuria with edema of the feet and ankles.

Several cases of thrombosis of the lower limbs from heart weakness have followed its use. Antifebrinum and Exalgine have produced symptoms of collapse and cyanosis, in some instances fatal, with great rapidity. One patient experienced, after taking Exalgine, a sensation that his head was so large that it seemed to occupy the whole room.

Eyes - Pallor of optic discs, contracted visual field and shrinking retinal vessel, mydriasis.

Head - Enlarged sensation. Fainting. Moral depravity. Given for migraines and in order to reduce fever.

Heart - Weak heart, irregular heartbeat with blue mucus membranes.

Lungs - Difficult respiration, as in a bad attack of asthma. As if the diaphragm ceased working.

ACETICUM ACIDUM

(Acetic acid)

PHARMACY - acet-ac. Aceticum acidum. Acetic acid. Vinegar. Glacial Acetic Acid. Dilutions. *Historical dose:* Tincture and all potencies.

CLINICAL - Ascites. Anemia. Anesthetics, poisoning. Anxiety. Ascarides. Birthmarks. Burns. Corns. Croup. Debility. Delirium. Diabetes. Diphtheria. Dropsy. Edema. Ebullitions. Emaciation. Fevers. Hydrophobia. Nevi. Narcotics, poisoning. Sausage, poisoning. Scalds. Scurvy. Skin, cancer. Stings. Stomach, cancer. Tuberculosis. Varicose, veins. Warts.

HOMEOPATHIC - Antidotes the effects of anesthesia (Phos.). For dullness or grogginess since anesthesia, with memory problems or chronic fatigue (Phos., Chlf., Nitro-o.).

Keynote waxy pale skin, anemia and severe water brash. The water brash is of a sour regurgitation during pregnancy (Carbov., Nat-p.). Intense thirst, burning in throat, nausea, retching and sour rising as met with in cases of cancer and debility. Used in the past as a tonic and to increase digestion.

Profound anemia with some dropsical edema symptoms. Great debility, frequent fainting, dyspnea, weak heart, vomiting, profuse urination and sweat. Hemorrhage from any part. Varicose swellings. Emaciation and debility. Especially indicated in pale, lean persons with lax, flabby muscles. Dropsy of abdomen and legs, anasarca, great thirst, pale, waxen skin. Edema, peripheral edema associated with anemia or protein loss through the urine.

Acetic acid has the power to *liquefy albuminous and fibrinous deposits*. Dissolves cancer cells.

W. Owens noted that it was useful for epithelial cancer internally and locally. Sycosis with nodules and formations in the joints. Hard chancre, the 1x solution will soften it and cause the formation of pus.

Changes gangrenous ulcers, hospital gangrene, prevents decomposition of animal matter.

There are gnawing, ulcerative pains in stomach, pain and burning in abdomen. Profuse, exhausting diarrhea. *Ebullitions*. Diabetes. Scurvy. Putrid and hectic fevers with night sweats.

MIND - Irritable. Very dull and low-spirited. Grieves much, sighs often. Horrible attacks of anxiety with difficult breathing. Borrows trouble, worried about business affairs. Grieves about his sickness and the children. Does not know her own children. Forgets what has recently happened. Confusion of ideas. Alternate stupor and delirium.

Abdomen - Distention of the abdomen, colicky pains. Inflammation of bowels during dentition. Abdomen feels as if sunken in when lying on his back. Frequent watery stools, worse in morning. *Tympanitic*. Ascites. Hemorrhage from bowels.

Back - Myelitis, with profuse urine, the pain in the back relieved only by lying on the abdomen.

Blood - Hemorrhages from nose, lungs, stomach, bowels, and uterus. Passive hemorrhages. Blood coagulated in veins. Blood vessels contracted. Varicose swellings. Chlorosis, anemia.

Constitutions - Suited to children and old people. For lax, pale, lean anemic persons.

Face - Pale, waxen, emaciated. Expression wild, pupils dilated. Bright red flush on both cheeks. Left cheek red during fever. Sweat on forehead in spots.

Female - Excessive menses. *Hemorrhages after labor*. Nausea of pregnancy. Metrorrhagia with great thirst after childbirth. Breasts painfully enlarged, distended with milk. Threatening abscess of the breast. Anemia of nursing mothers. Breast milk impoverished, bluish, sour, child droops, lose flesh, gets marasmus.

Food - Greatest burning thirst, with diabetes or dropsy. Insatiable even by taking large quantities. Thirsty with dry lips, which peel off in flakes. Nothirst with fever. Cold drinks disagree. Loss of appetite. Disgust for salted things and cold victuals. Bread and butter disagree. Vegetables, except potatoes, disagree.

Head - Blood rushes to head with delirium.

Temporal vessels distended. Child does not let its head be touched. Heaviness and dull pains in forehead and vertex. Headache from abuse of tobacco, opium, coffee, or alcohol.

Kidneys - Large quantities of pale urine. Diabetes with great thirst and debility (Ph-ac.).

Limbs - Emaciation. Edema of feet and legs with diarrhea. Varicose swellings.

Lungs - Hoarse, hissing respiration, *Difficult breathing*, *cough when inhaling*. Croup. Membranous croup. Irritation of trachea and bronchial tubes. False membrane in throat. Profuse bronchorrhea. Putrid sore throat (gargle). Hurried and laborious breathing. Rattling in chest.

Male - Weakening emissions, semen passes at stool. Prepuce thickened, fissured, can't be retracted and itches fearfully. Sexual passion, but feeble erection.

Mouth - Teeth feel dull, breath foul. Scorbutic ulcers, toothache. Sour taste. Epithelium of mouth quite white. Tongue pale and flabby.

Nose - Nosebleed especially from a fall or blow. Liable to frequent catarrhal attacks.

Rectum - Hemorrhages from bowels. Constipation, with great thirst and excess of pale urine. Chronic diarrhea of emaciated children. Diarrhea with great thirst and swelling of legs and feet. Diarrhea with colic pains. Ascarides.

Skin - Pale, cold, waxen, and edematous. Burning, dry, hot skin or bathed in profuse sweat. Diminished sensibility of the surface of body. Varicose swellings. Scurvy, anasarca. Bruises, sprains. Stings, bites, etc. Tetter-like eruptions. Nevi, warts, corns.

Sleep - Sleepless.
